The 1.5 hour virtual event brought together dignitaries and more than 30 communities to highlight culture, artistry, pride and history.

And the horror of Japanese Canadians forcibly removed from their homes to internment camps during World War II should not be forgotten. The global pandemic has resurfaced anti-Asian sentiment with escalating racist attacks, violence and fear. These realities make Asian Heritage Month more important than ever.

Cesar Cala, of Filipinos Rising said, "Join us in the 2021 Asian Heritage Month celebrations to recognize Asian Canadians as nation builders in the past and now. From the railways, to South Asian farmers, essential workers, teachers and service industry workers, the resilience of our community demonstrates our resolve.
